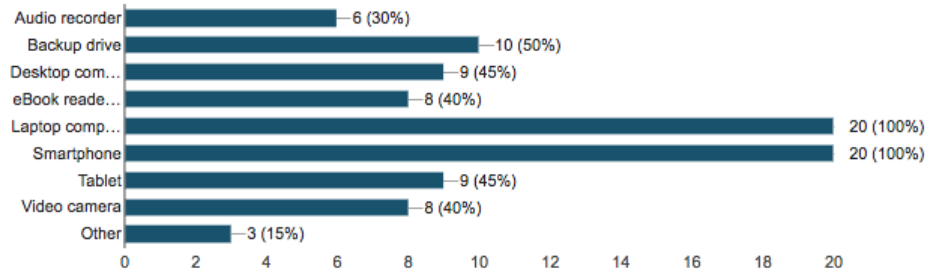

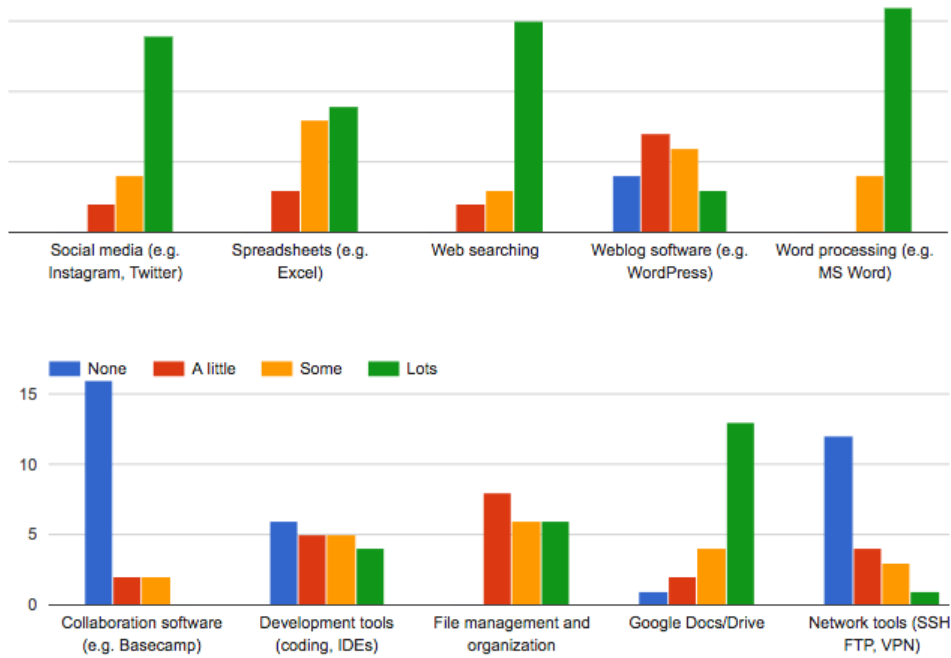
Do you enjoy writing with electronic tools? Why or why not?

20. No. I'm a perfectionist and have a tendency to revise while writing, making the process much longer. I actually bought a type writer over the summer to break that habit.

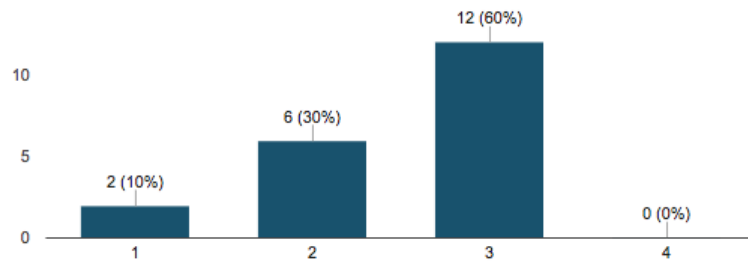
Which of the following devices do you own? (20 responses)
